

magine the unimaginable! How does one do that? How do you imagine that for which you have no language, prior experience or means of conception? We use our imagination to go beyond what we currently know, experience and envisage, and we do this by building upon present understanding and concepts. But how do we imagine that which defies such developmental thinking?

It is the season of Easter and I have the resurrection of Jesus in mind. What took place that first Easter broke the bounds of imagination. The appearance of Jesus, first to the women and then to the disciples, came 'out of the blue' as it were. It was completely unexpected. The disciples had given up on Jesus when they fled the scene in the garden, and the women only came to the tomb to anoint his body which had been hurriedly buried because of the Sabbath. The death of Jesus was catastrophic in terms of their faith in Jesus. They said as much: "We had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel." (Luke 24 v 21)

But then came the unimaginable - Jesus is raised from the dead! There are no categories in which this can be described, let alone understood. The gospel accounts of this reveal the overwhelming incomprehension that overtakes Jesus' followers. They were not prepared for this. Mark's gospel ends with the baffling account of the women who 'went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.' (Mark  $16\ v\ 8$ )

The resurrection of Jesus outstrips our imaginative capacities, but as it does so it gives us back the resources to re-imagine the world anew. The first followers of Jesus were changed dramatically;

no longer fearful and despairing they became brave and hope-filled and went out to change the world. This would have been beyond their imagination before that first Easter, but now it had become their reality! They help us to see that Jesus is God's way of creating a new world in which love overcomes death, goodness triumphs over evil and hope prevails over despair. This is a world that we are not only called to imagine this Easter, but above all to realise in all practical ways as God's Spirit leads us in the everyday service of the risen Christ.
