**I**magine going into the supermarket to do your weekly shop and being confronted by rows and rows of bottles, tins, packs, cartons each looking remarkably similar because they have no labels. How would you know what to look for, where it comes from, what the ingredients are, whether the fat content is high or low, and whether it is organic?

Labels help us identify things and inform us about them. They are part of our everyday lives. They make sense of our world and enable us to choose one from another. Whether it is shopping, homes, schools, political parties, sexuality, churches, other faiths, ethnic groups, nations, or indeed the people round about us, we have a label that fits. And so our world is compartmentalised, divided up and ordered according to our own tastes - and even prejudices. We know where we are with labels! They help us maintain clear boundaries, strong borders, and separate identities. We love our labelled world!

But imagine a world without labels. Imagine a world where "there is no longer Jew nor Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male or female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus" (St Paul, Galatians 3:28). Imagine a world where 'Names and sects and parties fall: Thou, O Christ, art all in all' (Charles Wesley). Imagine a world where the God who created all that exists placed his blessing upon it and 'saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good' (Genesis 1:31). Imagine a world where despite a lack of trustful response, God continues to make do without labels, and places his trust and blessing on the whole human family, on every one of us.

This is the world we know - it is full of labels colouring our views and separating us one from another and yet God invites us to see it with his unlabelled eyes as a place where all persons are truly brothers and sisters belonging to one marvellous, diverse and richly blessed human family. ## Three Very Different Evenings

At Pilots this term we have been very fortunate in having several visitors to our sessions. Both children and helpers are always pleased to welcome friends, parents and church members, for this shows that we are supported in the work we try to do in engaging young people in Christian values and thereby encouraging them to live their lives in a meaningful way.

On 16th June, Michelle King who is one of our officers and also the local area representative for Mission Aviation Fellowship, gave us another insight into the great work of this organisation, and presented to us some amazing examples of their dedication to improve the lives of people who are in great need, who live thousands of miles from our own shores and who only survive through the love, care and support they receive from the MAF team. Also on this evening a visitor from Bishop's Stortford URC, Ken Larman, gave a short talk and demonstration about his work as a navigator. His visit was much appreciated and we hope to have a further visit from Ken next term.

On 30th June, Catherine Dean came to visit us and share our evening. She is the local representative for Christian Aid and gave us all some food for thought on the much needed work of this organisation, and some ideas where we could improve our own carbon footprint. The children watched a DVD about the work of Christian Aid and completed some tasks set by Catherine.

To end our sessions for this term, Jan, Roger and Dipper (Dips) came to visit us once again on 14th July. Dipper, Jan's Golden Labrador Guide Dog, was patted by many Pilot hands and admired for his



dedication to all the needs of his owner. It was easy to see how he had passed the many guide dog tests that he had to achieve before becoming Jan's 'eyes'. We saw a DVD showing the work of guide dogs and how they have to train with their owners for a long time before becoming fully fledged. We want to thank Jan, Roger and Dipper for being with us on that evening as they were moving to Swindon the very next day at 8.30 am.

Allen Morton, our new URC minister, also paid us a visit during this session, and got to know some of the children, helpers and parents. Allen told us of one of his hobbies (painting) and brought along some of his art work to show us. Next term when we have one of our craft evenings, Allen is going to come along and join in our activities, and we are all looking forward to his being with us once again. As usual Cherry and Michelle produced some great refreshments which we all enjoyed very much. We have been helped by Sarah Godfrey for the last few sessions and we hope to see her again next term.

#### Future Events

During the Church Harvest Festival on 21st September, the Pilots are being presented with the Pilot Plaque which is to be placed somewhere (not yet decided) on the church, where visitors and friends can see that we have an active group of Pilots at Stansted Free Church. ## Church Deacon Vacancy

## From the Church Meeting

During the recent church meeting, Allen suggested the idea of a **prayer chain** – something which had worked well in his previous church. Anyone can join the chain, as long as they can be contacted by telephone. When a prayer need is identified, the first person on the chain is contacted, who then makes contact with the next person on the list and so on. If a person on the list cannot be contacted, then it goes to the next person, so there is no necessity to be always available. Anyone is welcome to request prayer, and the need is not just limited to people connected with our church. Janet Townsend has agreed to be the first person in the chain and if you are willing to be part of the **prayer chain**, please contact Janet as soon as possible, or if you would like to know more, please telephone Allen on 757635. All prayer needs are confidential.

There was also discussion about how we could make the **intercessions** during our Sunday worship meet the needs of our



fellowship and the local community more effectively. Two ideas were discussed: writing prayer requests in a book; and writing prayer requests on slips which would be available in the church (with pens!) and then collected up during the service. The book or the prayer slips would be used by the person leading worship as the basis for the intercessions. The book would be a permanent record and would stay in the church; the slips would be kept and passed to the ministers each month. It was felt that the slips would be better and the Church Oversight group will discuss the idea further at their next meeting in August.
