

magine the worst! As human beings we are sometimes inclined to pessimism about the turn of events. Imagination can act like a virus dissolving our normal cheerful disposition, capturing us in melancholy or worse. Atheist pundits accuse Christians of living in an imaginary world of escapism. Marx famously accused us of peddling opium to the people. Yet can these clear-eyed realists offer hope for a world that watches daily the horrors of the last few weeks?

It goes without saying that it can be a sign of madness when a person starts to imagine things compulsively. On the other hand, imagination can be a powerful springboard for change to the good. It has been said that we are the only creatures who can imagine. A chimpanzee tends not to absorb his mind for days in a Danielle Steel novel!

At the Herts and Souls Community Choir workshop last weekend a group of amateurs learned the extraordinary power of meditation as an instrument of change. Michael Cantwell invited us to use our imaginations to get under the skin of a pauper in 1830s Paris, and then experience the way it changed our performance of the discontented crowd at the start of *Les Miserables*. It had a powerful impact. A crowd of Soulsters were soon angrily finger-pointing at the rich in their carriages (in our imagination of course!).

When we follow in Christ's way we are living in the expectation of a changed world in which Christ will come into his Kingdom. Can we allow our imagination to help bring about this change? The present age has always been desperate. Marx's "Religion is the sigh of the oppressed creature, the heart of a heartless world, and the soul of soulless conditions" has a resonance with Romans' "The whole creation groans and travails in pain together". We cling to the hope that Christ saves us from that pain and travail. .../cont

By imagining how Christ can transform us, we can open our eyes to new paths in which he can lead us. If we fix our eyes on Him we can strengthen our resolve, see beyond the despair of the present moment and start to imagine a new world into being. As Paul says in 2 Thessalonians 2 v 16-17 "Now may our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us eternal comfort and good hope by grace, comfort and strengthen your hearts in every good work and word".
