


magine the astronomy professor's delight when Galloway Forest was recently designated one of the world's only five Dark Parks. The other four are all in the USA. Being a very dense forest and situated in a sparsely populated bit of South West Scotland, light pollution is at an unusually low level. From there, stargazers enjoy spectacularly pristine views of the Milky Way, seeing thousands upon thousands more stars than would be visible through the artificial light of urban areas. Looking up at the night sky might also encourage people to raise spiritual, life questions. UK co-ordinator of the International Year of Astronomy, Steve Owens said on a news website: 'Gazing upwards can prompt some profound inward gazing too.'

Imagine the Bethlehem shepherds around their campfire, keeping watch over their flocks, alert to every sound in the surrounding dark, but occasionally gazing up at the moon and stars, wondering, 'What are mere mortals amid such immensity that you, God, should be mindful of us?' So lost against the vastness of it all, yet given regal status: 'You crown us with glory and honour, and put all things under our feet'. In close touch with the rhythms of the natural world, maybe these shepherds were more mindful than most of the one to whom the world truly belonged. To such 'frail creatures of the passing day', to quote Lord George Mcleod, founder of the modern Iona Community, comes the intimations of God. Luke imagines the shepherds as drawn from the edges of existence to centre stage to hear the Good News. The real Saviour of the world is a baby in a manger, not some tyrant who orders armies and crucifies dissent. The God we adore was in a young mother's arms, gazing up at us. Imagine!

The Chapel will however, still be used as a community hall for the village. The local Anglican Church have put in a firm offer to purchase the premises for a hall to be used for educational, spiritual and cultural purposes.

### Additional Reports to Synod

During the morning session there were other reports given, including Executive, Resource, Pastoral and Mission Committees, and I have copies of these for anyone who wishes to read them in depth.

### Child Friendly Church Award

This was awarded to Epping URC and Christ Church, Ipswich.

### Workshops

During the day there were various workshops for members to attend. Peter and I attended two sessions, one *Engaging with Families* and the other *Working with Small Numbers of Children and Young People*. We thought these were both appropriate to our own church situation. After discussions in both groups we found that other churches had similar problems to ourselves and we were able to obtain some useful feedback. One main point that we found to be particularly relevant to most churches was to make services attractive to children and young people, not just thinking of our own traditional ways of worshipping. During the lunch hour we were able to visit the book stall and Fairtrade displays and it was good to talk with other delegates and friends among them being, Sylvia Paine (Pilot Desk Officer) and Henry Playle (Youth Development Officer) and Rev Allen Morton, our Minister. We enjoyed the day and found it rewarding.
