

magine living in the aftermath of Haiti's earthquake. Television graphically portrayed mounds of rubble, once people's homes, replaced by makeshift shelters. People slept in the open, fearing after-shocks. Worst of all was seeing an injured child, breath rattling, likely to die in a few hours for want of sufficient medicines and transportation. Days elapsed and angry survivors felt abandoned by the rest of the world.

It is staggering that the seat of this earthquake is an ancient fault line. Two giant segments of the Earth's crust ground against each other, then, one over the other. Laws of geophysics are working, as they must, but with terrifying impact! More incredible are the naïve ideas about God always voiced after a natural disaster. For some there is no God; natural disasters are just that. However, human beings are by nature given to reflect on life and death happenings. Certain understandings of human development and personal growth hold that to be fully human is to live in an integrated way at five levels all at once - body, feeling, intellect, soul and spirit. Much harder is it to imagine not asking question! Better to ask, not, why has this happened, as if seeking to blame but, now that this has happened, what are we to do?

Haiti, its plight compounded by extreme poverty, has a history of bad governments and violence. Externally, unfair world trade rules work against democratic progress and economic independence. Yet, some Haitians can now imagine their nation rising anew from the ruins of the old. Isaiah imagined communities transformed: 'The sound of weeping, the cry of distress will be heard in her no more. They will not toil to no purpose or raise children for misfortune.' Isaiah 65: 19-23]. Let us imagine the prophetic vision made real in our time.


## **Pilots**
