My father recently gave me the book in which my mother recorded details of when my two brothers and I achieved certain milestones in our early years. The first recorded events are our birthdays. However, how many of us celebrate our christening day? According to the book, I was christened on July 4th. If I did celebrate it now it would be tinged with poignancy, as my mother died on July 4th. A few pages on in the book, I was amused (or not!) to see dates for when my two brothers first smiled, but alas no entry for me, so that's one anniversary less to celebrate. The latest entry with my name against it is April 17th 1949. What did I achieve then? Apparently I started crawling! Fortunately my mother appears to have become bored with the book after a while, so the spaces for 'first steps' and 'first bathe' are still blank. All three of us seem to have managed to avoid having these exciting events recorded for the edification of posterity!

Just imagine what it would be like to have everything recorded throughout our lives, rather than just during the early years of innocence. Well, the bad news is that everything is recorded. Not just the first time it happens either. Every smile, every step, every tear, every success, every failure is noted by God. The good news is that God doesn't write them in a book to be produced as evidence at the day of judgement. No, I like to imagine that God actually uses them as waymarks to help us progress along a daily path that is right for us. It's a bit like the supermarket loyalty card which remembers everything we have purchased in the past so we can be guided to buy similar or complementary products in the future. God does not expect us to change our behaviour in dramatic ways, but if we have been spending our lives just visiting the sandwich counter we could be missing out on some of the delights of the smorgasbord.

This month at Stansted Free Church we celebrate all that has happened in the first three years of our unity. Some of it has been recorded, some of it not, but we can look back with gratitude and see how far we have come with God's help. We do not know how God wants us to move forward, but we must trust him to use the knowledge of where we have been, to lead us closer to his will. Whether that includes laying off the (hymn) sandwiches remains to be seen!


