

I am hoping to join them next summer when the World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women (WFMUCW) meet for their 12th World Assembly. I have wonderful memories of the 10th Assembly in Loughborough which I attended in 2001. The vibrancy of the women in their colourful, flamboyant dress, their constant praising God, and frequently bursting into song and dance was unforgettable; and their enthusiasm was infectious. There were daily prayers, bible study, group discussions and many opportunities to share experiences and understand each other's situations.

The 12th World Assembly is entitled 'Bambelela!' (Never Give Up -Christ is our Hope). We shall be sharing our experiences of tackling the Millenium Development Goals (MDGs). You may remember that at one of the Easter Offering Services at our Church we focussed on the 8 MDGs set by the United Nations. The Women's Network of the Methodist Church has always been a member of WFMUCW and had close links. Following recent restructuring within Methodism, the two organisations are joining to become Methodist Women in Britain (MWiB). The aim of MWiB is to know Christ and make him known, encouraging, enabling and equipping women to participate fully in the life of the Church and in society, supporting the Church to become truly the whole people of God. MWiB encourages women to develop creative Christian spirituality and practical social action in a global context. Locally we have a District Day in Chelmsford on 25th September when Esther Hume will be inducted as Network District President 2010-11; and further afield at Newark on 9th October 'Oppression to Empowerment' - a day exploring MDG 3.
